SONDRA BENDER

2008 SEASON: third place in the local standings with 23 wins, all with trainer Larry Murray, winning at a 25.6% rate.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS: Foufa's Warrior finished seventh in the 2003 Preakness and won the Maryland Juvenile Championship a year earlier...in 2002 won 13 stakes races with seven different horses and finished 53rd on the North American money list with \$1.3 million...La Reine's Terms won five added money races, each at a different track...bred nine stakes winners in 2002, including seven who competed in the Bender colors...in 2003 tied Michael Gill for the most stakes wins in the state with seven and bred six stakes winners, including five that ran in the Bender colors...other favorite horses include Don's Choice (2nd in Jim Dandy), Secret Odds (2nd in the Champagne) and multiple stakes winners Promenade Girl (Grade II Molly Pitcher winner in '06), King's Nest and Clever Power...owned Southern Appeal who ran in the 1986 Kentucky Derby...had a special bond with jockey Kent Desormeaux who rode Snow King and King Snow.

PERSONAL: Sondra and her husband Howard are partners in the Saratoga Friends Stable...the couple and Bob Leonard own Glade Valley Farm in Frederick.

ROBERT COLE

2008 SEASON: topped the Maryland standings for the third consecutive year with 39 victories from 118 starts, an impressive 33.1% rate, including four with four different trainers at Pimlico on May 9...won the Laurel winter and Pimlico spring meetings...local trainers include Scott Lake, Howard Wolfendale and John Rigattieri...actually won seven races on May 9 (four at Pimlico & three other out-of-town)...led the nation in victories with a career-best 234 and was 11th in earnings (career-high \$3.3 million).

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS: his biggest score was claiming Shake You Down from the Laurel barn of Luigi Gino in 2003 and watching the horse blossom into one of the best sprinters in the country under the tutelage of trainer Scott Lake, winning three graded races and finishing in the money in a pair of Grade I's (second in Breeders' Cup Sprint and third in De Francis Dash)... topped the Maryland standings in 2006 with 49 victories with an impressive 42.2% winning percentage and ranked third among the nations leaders in wins (190) and was 10th in earnings with \$3.1 million...finished first in the local standings in 2007 with 33 victories, including won Maryland Million Turf Sprint with Happy Surprise...ranked overall ranked third among the nations leaders in wins (159) and was 15th in earnings (\$2.7 million)...tied for second among Maryland owners in 2001 with 32 victories... in 2001 his horses won at a 28% clip and finished in the money 104 times in 190 starts (65%)...ranked among the nations leaders in wins and earnings in 2001, 2003, 2005, 2006, 2007 and 2008.

MICHAEL GILL

2008 SEASON: finished with four victories at Pimlico and Laurel Park... Team Gill has 531 victories in the state since moving a stable here in late 2001.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS: Eclipse Award for outstanding owner in 2005 leading the nation in wins (351) and earnings (\$6.4 million)... dominated the local standings for the fourth consecutive year, winning 83 races with earnings exceeding \$1.5 million... the familiar blue colors captured all four meets and had won 14 consecutive stands at the major Maryland tracks... dominated the local standings in 2004 (153 wins for more than \$3 million) and 2003 (145 victories for earnings greater than \$3 million)... runner-up for the Eclipse Award for outstanding owner after both years... in 2004 led the nation in both wins (487—seven off Don Lasaster's all-time record set in 1974) and earnings (\$10.8 million)... in 2003 led the nation in both wins (425) and earnings (\$9.2 million)... led Maryland in victories in 2002, winning 110 races (81 more than the runner-up) with earnings of \$2.3 million... won four races in Maryland on March 23, 2002, January 15, 2004 and 2004 Pimlico Special/Black-Eyed Susan day... finished second in the country for wins in 2000 and 2002 and was fifth in 2001... purchased his first horse in 1999.

PERSONAL: stable once featured nearly 400 horses, including 90 based in Maryland.

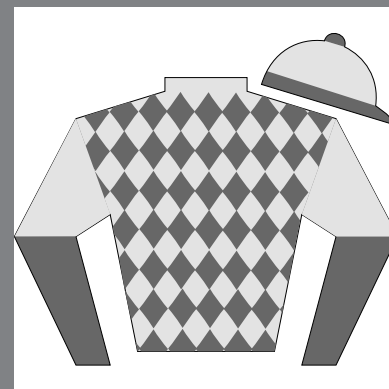

ROBERT MEYERHOFF (FITZHUGH LLC)

2008 SEASON: won 11 races in Maryland, including three stakes victories with Hartigan... the Richard Small trainee took the Hilltop, Pearl Necklace and Twixt Stakes.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS: entered the racing industry with his brother Harry in 1963... owned Include who earned \$1,435,000 in 2001 with five stakes victories, including a dramatic victory over Albert the Great in the Grade I Pimlico Special... also owned multiple-stakes winner Concern, the first Maryland-bred to win the Breeders' Cup Classic (1994)... Concern finished 3rd in the Preakness that year... also owned multiple-stakes winner Broad Brush who earned \$2.7 million from 1985-1987... Broad Brush was 3rd in the 1986 Preakness and had a pair of graded victories as a four-year old (Suburban Handicap & Santa Anita Handicap)... earned \$370,000 when Dynamic Deputy, Take A Check and Sticky finished second-third-and fourth respectively in the 2006 Delaware Handicap (Grade II)... raced under Bon Etage Farm until 1974... leading breeder in the state eight times since 1986.

PERSONAL: boards all of his mares at Fitzhugh Farm, his 300 acre farm... maintains 20-25 broodmares and about 30 horses in training... president of Henderson Webb, which constructs townhouses in the Baltimore metropolitan area... ranks in the top 25 of most generous philanthropists, giving away \$304 million from 2000-2004.

PTK LLC

2008 SEASON: second in the state with 25 victories...captured the fall title with 15 trips to the winners' circle, one more than Robert Cole...ranked 50th nationally with 46 victories for more than \$725,000 with trainers Rodney Jenkins and Dane Kobiskie.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS: owned horses since 1999...the first two (Gypsy Outfit & March In Time) scored a daily double for trainer Ferris Allen and jockey Mario Pino in their first starts in PTK colors...ranked second in the state in victories in 2002 and 2003...those two years PTK ranked in the top 50 nationally in wins and top 100 in earnings, topping the \$1 million mark each campaign.

PERSONAL: grew up minutes from Hollywood Park and Santa Anita...very superstitious, her horses never race on the 13th and when stakes winner Ken Doll runs, she always carries a Barbie Doll.

ROB RY FARMS (ROBERT HAYNES)

2008 SEASON: named Owner of the Year by Maryland Horse Breeders

Association...Heros Reward finished in the money in five of seven stakes races during the year, including a repeat victory in the Turf Sprint at Pimlico on the Preakness undercard for the second consecutive year and finished fifth in the 2008 Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint at Santa Anita...won GR III Bill Hartack Handicap with Ryan's for Real.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS: Heros Reward named Maryland Horse of the Year in 2007, which included nine first or second finishes in 10 starts and victories in the Turf Sprint on the Preakness undercard, the GII \$500,000 Neartic Stakes at Woodbine and the Governor's Cup, Penn National's signature race...captured 2006 Maryland Million Classic with former claimer Due.

PERSONAL: been in the business for more than 30 years, first as a fan (first visit to the track was at Laurel where he won his first bet) then as a jockey agent and finally an owner..
