NATIONAL TREASURE made the early lead without coaxing, was kept well off the inner rail approaching the first turn, moved n entering the turn, set the pace slightly off the rail down the backstretch, eased out in upper stretch, was challenged by BLAZING SEVENS in upper stretch, dueled, was bumped near the sixteenth pole, dug in tenaciously and twice bumped with BLAZING SEVENS approaching the finish. BLAZING SEVENS, well wide entering the first turn, stalked the pace outside horses down the backstretch, took aim on the leader past the three eighths, bid for the lead outside NATIONAL TREASURE in upper stretch, dueled, bumped that one when drifting in near the sixteenth pole, finished gamely and twice bumped with NATIONAL TREASURE near the finish. MAGE , slightly off the inner rail on the first turn, rated between horses while stalking the pace down the backstretch, eased out four to five in upper stretch, drifted in briefly behind the top pair in mid stretch and finished evenly. RED ROUTE ONE , brushed by COFFEEWITHCHRIS leaving the starting gate, raced along the inner rail on the first turn, steadied when rank entering the backstretch, remained along the inner rail advancing near the five eighths, saved ground on the far turn, eased put in upper stretch and lacked the needed rally. CHASE THE CHAOS lacked speed, raced near the inner rail on the first turn, was off the rail down the backstretch, swung wide turning for home and passed tired horses. PERFORM lacked speed, raced putside horses down the backstretch, entered the stretch in the three path and weakened. COFFEEWITHCHRIS came out at the break, prompted the winner while snugly in hand down the backstretch, was under urging on the far turn and tired entering the stretch. A supplemental nomination was added to increase the purse to \(\$ 1,650,000\). The winning numbers for the TWO DAY ALL DIRT STAKES were 2/4/5/8/9-2/6-10-4/8-1.
